

"Just are you, O Holy One, who is and who was, for you brought these judgments. ⁶For they have shed the blood of saints and prophets, and you have given them blood to drink. It is what they deserve!"

⁷And I heard the altar saying,

"Yes, Lord God the Almighty, true and just are your judgments!" ⁸The fourth angel poured out his bowl on the sun, and it was allowed to scorch people with fire. ⁹They were scorched by the fierce heat, and they cursed the name of God who had power over these plagues. They did not repent and give him glory. ¹⁰The fifth angel poured out his bowl on the throne of the beast, and its kingdom was plunged into darkness. People gnawed their tongues in anguish ¹¹and cursed the God of heaven for their pain and sores. They did not repent of their deeds.

¹²The sixth angel poured out his bowl on the great river Euphrates, and its water was dried up, to prepare the way for the kings from the east. ¹³And I saw, coming out of the mouth of the dragon and out of the mouth of the beast and out of the mouth of the false prophet, three unclean spirits like frogs. ¹⁴For they are demonic spirits, performing signs, who go abroad to the kings of the whole world, to assemble them for battle on the great day of God the Almighty. ¹⁵("Behold, I am coming like a thief! Blessed is the one who stays awake, keeping his garments on, that he may not go about naked and be seen exposed!") ¹⁶And they assembled them at the place that in Hebrew is called Armageddon. ¹⁷The seventh angel poured out his bowl into the air, and a loud voice came out of the temple, from the throne, saying, "It is done!" ¹⁸And there were flashes of lightning, rumblings, peals of thunder, and a great earthquake such as there had never been since man was on the earth, so great was that earthquake. ¹⁹ The great city was split into three parts, and the cities of the nations fell, and God remembered Babylon the great, to make her drain the cup of the wine of the fury of his wrath. ²⁰And every island fled away, and no mountains were to be found. ²¹And great hailstones, about one hundred pounds each⁴⁰, fell from heaven on people; and they cursed God for the plague of the hail, because the plague was so severe.⁴¹

As Destroyer crosses the equatorial plane headed south and outbound, we will again encounter the trailing edge of the rings / shroud. Assuming some level of symmetry in the system, we might expect to experience the tail of the dragon approximately 30 days following perihelion. There will be red dust, red rain, impacts from space, hail and fire from space, and **darkness** ... at a similar level of intensity to that experienced during the first crossing, just 70 days in model time earlier. There will be the same risk of derivative effects of famine, drought, plague, pestilence, civil instability, and political instability.⁴² I'm not sure human systems can handle a one, two, three punch like that.

The new risk during this exit from the inner solar system was described by the Prophet Isaiah in Chapter 30. Destroyer will finish its work **on the Sun**. Isaiah wrote "Moreover, the light of the moon will be as the light of the sun, and the light of the sun will be sevenfold, as the light of seven days, in the day when the LORD binds up the brokenness of his people"⁴³ and St. John wrote "... the fourth Angel poured out his vial upon the sun; and power was given unto him to scorch men with fire. And men were scorched with great heat, and blasphemed the name of God, which hath power over these plagues: and they repented not to give him glory".⁴⁴

⁴⁰ 100# Hailstones made of ice would be about 17-18 inches in diameter. 100# Hailstones made of solid stone would have a diameter of about 13-14 inches. The original Greek uses the weight "talent" which might be as large as 130# if St. John was referring to the common heavy talent, or 75# if St. John was referencing the temple talent.
